
HE Officers and Members of our Club want to express by means of this page, their appreciation and thanks for your interest as well as for your kind support and co-operation in en-

ROUMANIAN INDEPENDENCE

The history of Roumania begins with the conquest of Dacia by the Roman Emperor, Marcus Ulpius Trajanus, at about 101 to 103 A. D. Upon the Pillar of Trajanus in Rome are engraved the principal episodes of this conquest.

However, modern Roumania began to take shape only in 1859 when after the Principalities of Wallachia and Moldavia, obtaining some sort of freedom from the enforced "protectorate" of Russia and Turkey, upon being called to elect a reigning prince, both Moldavia on January 5th and Wallachia on January 24th, elected one and the same ruler in the person of Col. Alexander John Cuza.

Accordingly, by 1862 the unification was accom-

plished and the recognition followed.

The new Prince during his reign (1859 to 1866) realized two great reforms: the Secularization of the estates belonging to Monastaries which due to certain conditions attained some one-fifth of the land; and the first agrarian reform by turning over to the peasants the land they tilled.

Due to certain movements on foot, **Cuza** resigned his high position in February of 1866 and the political and other leaders, after due consideration, agreed upon offering the throne to Prince Charles of Hohenzolern-Sigmaringen who, upon accepting, set out for Roumania and entered the Capital City on May 10, 1866.

Prince Chrales I, was the founder of the present dynasty.

At the beginning of 1877, after concluding a military convention with Russia tending toward military cooperation in the Russo-Turkish War, the Roumanian Parliament on May 10, 1877 proclaimed Roumania's independence from Turkey.

On May 10, 1881 Charles I, was crowned King of Roumania and a period of peace and reconstruction followed during which Roumania progressed both materially and spiritually. However, the Balkan War of 1912-1914, upon reaching certain stages brought about Roumania's intervention for the purpose of quelling the belligerents and the Treaty of Bucarest again brought peace in that area.

On May 10, 1937, Roumanians from everywhere, including United States, celebrated with great fast.


